Collection Details

Biographical:

1836 Mary Ann Lynch was born.

1855 Mary Lynch married John Graham Meritt in Warrick, Indiana on May 10.

1856 Charles Alphus Meritt was born to Mary and John. He died by 1860.

1858 Emily Meritt was born to Mary and John. She died by 1863.

1863 John Meritt was born to Mary and John.

1863 John Graham Meritt was imprisoned on December 23.

1864 John Graham Meritt died on November 15. John G. Meritt's letters state he was at the military prison in Alton, Illinois. However, Prisoner of War records indicate he was at Camp Douglas in Chicago, Illinois and buried at the Chicago City Cemetery. He might have been at both prisons at one point or another.

1870 Mary Ann Lynch married her second husband, Elihue C. Castle, on June 18 in Warrick, Indiana.

1872 Emma May Castle was born to Mary and Elihue.

1879 Mary Ann Lynch-Meritt-Castle died on April 22 and is buried at Castle Cemetery in Newburgh, Indiana.

Scope and Content:

The records of the Mary Ann Lynch-Meritt-Castle collection include correspondence, promissory notes, physicians receipts, leave of absence notes, passenger receipt, and a newspaper article. The strength of the collection are the letters from 1864 to 1870.

The "Correspondence" series ranges from 1864 to 1870 and includes correspondence with Mary. The letters start with her husband in a military prison. After her husband died, she moved back to Indiana and began receiving letters from friends back in Arkansas. She also received letters from two potential beaus, and one did become her second husband. Almost every letter lists out deaths and marriages along with general happenings in town.

The "Notes and Receipts" series are split into two sections; the biggest is for John G. Meritt, the second is for Mary. John's notes include promissory notes, leave of absence notes, and physician's notes. Mary's items include a passenger receipt and a newspaper article on the Newlands and Meritt Mine in Joplin, Missouri.

System of Arrangement:

This collection is organized into two series: "Series 1. Correspondence" and "Series 2. Notes and Receipts." The records of this series are filed chronologically. Unknown dates were placed in the back of the series.
